CODE OF CONDUCT

At GNLC, we uphold a high standard of professionalism, discipline, and respect to create a safe and productive learning environment. Every student is expected to adhere to the following principles:

1. Professionalism & Respect

- Treat instructors, staff, and fellow students with courtesy, respect, and professionalism at all times.
- Active listening and constructive feedback are encouraged to maintain a positive learning experience.
- Discriminatory remarks, offensive language, and disrespectful behaviour will not be tolerated.

2. Safety & Compliance

- Safety is our top priority. Follow all safety rules, regulations, and Occupational Health & Safety (OH&S) guidelines during both classroom and fieldwork.
- Failure to comply with safety protocols may result in disciplinary action, including dismissal from the program.

3. Attendance & Punctuality

- Attendance is mandatory for all scheduled classes, field exercises, and evaluations.
- Students must arrive on time and be fully prepared for the day's training.
- Repeated tardiness or absenteeism may result in removal from the program.

4. Proper Attire & PPE Compliance

- Students must wear GNLC-approved work attire, including:
 - o Steel-toe boots
 - o Hard hat
 - o Safety glasses
 - o Climbing belt and harness (when required)
 - o High-visibility vests
 - o Gloves and any additional PPE specified for training
- Failure to wear proper PPE may result in dismissal from field exercises.

5. Cleanliness & Organization

- Maintain a clean and organized work environment in classrooms, training areas, and living quarters.
- Tools and equipment must be returned to their designated storage areas after use.

6. Technology & Distractions

- Cell phones and personal electronic devices may only be used during designated breaks.
- Use of devices during training or fieldwork is strictly prohibited unless required for learning purposes.

7. Accountability & Responsibility

- Complete all assignments, tests, and fieldwork on time and with integrity.
- Students are expected to take initiative and demonstrate leadership and teamwork in all activities.

8. Zero Tolerance for Harassment & Bullying

- Harassment, bullying, intimidation, or any form of misconduct will not be tolerated.
- This includes physical, verbal, or online harassment of peers or staff.
- Incidents must be reported immediately to an instructor or administrator.

9. Compliance with GNLC Policies

- Adhere to all GNLC policies regarding attendance, behavior, and program expectations.
- Violations may result in disciplinary action, suspension, or expulsion from the program.

10. Academic Integrity

- All evaluations, exams, and practical exercises must be completed honestly and without cheating.
- Plagiarism or dishonest behavior will lead to immediate disciplinary action.

SAFETY POLICIES

At GNLC, safety is non-negotiable. Every student is responsible for ensuring a safe work environment by following the policies outlined below:

1. PPE Requirements

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) must be worn at all times during field training and practical exercises.
- Instructors will inspect PPE before field exercises—damaged PPE must be replaced immediately.

2. Pre-Job Safety Assessments (JSA)

- Before starting any task, students must conduct a Job Safety Analysis (JSA) to identify potential hazards.
- Hazards must be mitigated before work begins.

3. Lockout/Tagout Training Procedures (LOTO)

- LOTO procedures must be followed when working with electrical systems or equipment to prevent accidental energization.
- Students will be trained in proper LOTO procedures and must demonstrate competency before participating in live exercises.

4. Fall Protection & Climbing Safety

- All students must use fall arrest systems when working at heights.
- Proper pole climbing techniques will be enforced—unsafe climbing practices will result in removal from training.

5. Minimum Approach Distance (MAD) Compliance

- Maintain safe distances from energized lines and equipment in accordance with industry standards.
- Failure to comply will result in immediate corrective action.

6. Lifting & Material Handling

- Use proper lifting techniques to avoid back and joint injuries.
- Mechanical aids should be used for heavy lifting when available.

7. Reporting Unsafe Conditions

- All students must report:
 - o Unsafe conditions
 - o Near-misses
 - o Accidents
 - o Equipment malfunctions
- Failure to report a safety issue is a violation of GNLC policy.

8. Fire & Emergency Preparedness

- Know the location of fire extinguishers, exits, and emergency assembly points.
- Follow GNLC's emergency response protocols in the event of a fire, electrical hazard, or medical emergency.

9. Situational Awareness & Focus

- Stay alert and attentive during all field training and practical exercises.
- Fatigue, distractions, or reckless behaviour will result in removal from activities.

10. Mandatory Safety Briefings & Drills

- Attendance at daily safety briefings and emergency drills is required.
- Safety knowledge will be tested periodically to ensure retention.
